In fact as I write this letter, I've just returned from the first scheduled funfly of the season where several possible new members were in attendance.

Several excellent electric helicopters were also demonstrated. These choppers could do everything a gas powered helicopter could do, with flight times of 7- 8 minutes. A tiny helicopter from Japan was on display, it weighed in at little over 5 oz RTF! However its price tag wasn't as small, costing over \$1500.00! This annual gathering is a real blast and a great place to get new ideas, see new products and learn about electric flight. Yes, I did get my P-47 finished to take there, but was too chicken to make a maiden flight in front of several hundred spectators.
